The Course is made up of SJ & simulated XC fences with an optimum time & no style marks. Larger arenas may use secured XC portables. Riders will jump a series of show jumps and then proceed immediately into the XC phase which is run on an optimum time of 350- 375m/m.

Warm Up Class 60cm - clear round rosettes only, no placings. Entry fee £20

Class A Mini 70-75cm Team & Individual (Hickstead qualifier) Single phase. All team riders automatically count as individuals.

Class B Novice 80-85cm Team & Individual (Hickstead qualifier) Single phase. All team riders automatically count as individuals.

Class C Intermediate 90-95cm Team & Individual (Hickstead qualifier) Single phase. All team riders automatically count as individuals

Class D 1m-1.05 Open Team & Individual (Hickstead qualifier) Single phase. All team riders automatically count as individuals

Teams of 3 or 4, best 3 scores to count Entry Fee for classes A-D = £30.00 Paramedic First Aid Cover £5 per rider - please pay with your entry (there is an extra 'class' for it)

National Schools NSEA Show Jumping Qualifier

1st & 2nd placed team & 1-4th placed individuals will qualify for the 25th annual NSEA National Schools Championships 2023 October 2023

3rd -8th placed team & 5th-8th placed individuals will qualify for the NSEA Championship Plate 2023 October 2023

NSEA Cumbria County SJ Qualifiers (same entry fee)

Note- the highest placed team & individual for the relevant county will be given the title 'County Champion' and will qualify for the NSEA County Finals at Hickstead May 2023

This competition is open to schools from all counties and will count for RPL points

Class 1 Mini 70-75cm Team & Individual Qualifier (Riders to be aged under 14 on 1st January 2023) Single phase. All team riders automatically count as individuals. Team & Individual County Qualifier Team & Individual Qualifier for the County finals,

Class 2 Novice 80-85cm Team & Individual Qualifier Single phase. All team riders automatically count as individuals. Team & Individual County Qualifier Team & Individual Qualifier for the County finals,



Class 3 Intermediate 90-95cm Team & Individual Qualifier. Single phase. All team riders automatically count as individuals Team & Individual County Qualifier Team & Individual Qualifier for the County finals, Class 4 1m-1.05 Open Team & Individual Qualifier Single phase. All team riders automatically count as individuals Team & Individual County Qualifier Team & Individual Qualifier for the County finals,

Class 5a/b 1.10m Advanced Open Individual Qualifier Single phase. This class will be split into 5a) Horses, 5b) Ponies (2 x horses and 2 x ponies to qualify) Individual County Qualifier

Classes will run with the Warm Up first, followed by the EC, then the SJ of each height. Finishing with the Hickstead Elite Classes. SJ Classes £20 each - one entry covers 3 qualifiers

Horses and ponies may compete in a maximum of 4 classes throughout the day.

Hickstead Elite Show Jumping Qualifiers 2023 Hickstead Elite 1m Team Qualifier 2023

Teams of 3 or 4, best 3 scores to count. 1 round, single phase.



Hickstead Elite 1.10 Individual Qualifier 2023

Individual 1.10m qualifiers for section a) 2 x horses and section b) 2 x ponies (separate sections) Distances will be shortened in combinations for the pony section. 1 round single phase.

NSEA Eventers Challenge Rules for Scoring 2022-23

The intention of these rules is to reward riders who have a clear round and to penalise riders who have jumping penalties or who are significantly faster than the Optimum Time. Where there are several competitors with a clear round, then the nearest to the Optimum Time will win, rewarding an appropriate judgement of pace around the course.

EC1) Open to Teams and Individuals

- Riders will jump a course of 5-8 show jumps and then proceed immediately into the XC phase of 8-15 simulated XC fences, depending on the size of the arena
- The speed for the XC phase will be between 320m/m to 375m/m depending on the size of the arena smaller arena = tighter turns which slow you down. A larger arena with flowing lines will ride on a quicker time. The speed for each class will be given in the schedule or on the noticeboard at the event. Times will be recorded to one-hundredth of a second if the timing equipment allows.
- NSEA/BE Eventing Rules for tack and rider equipment for XC.
- There will be no style mark. No age restriction on the mini (70/75) class.
- Top two teams and 4 Individuals at each height to qualify for the NSEA Eventers Challenge Championship to be held at Hickstead in May.

EC2) Dress: XC colours, body protectors are compulsory. Hair must be above collar length, long hair to be kept in place in a hair net. Rider must wear BE approved skull caps, no fixed peak SJ hats.

EC3) The competitor with the fewest penalties wins. In the event of a tie, the competitor closest to the optimum time will be the winner. In the team competition, the total of the best three scores is used to place the team. The combined difference from the Optimum Time of the 3 best scores is used to break any ties.

EC4) The top 2 teams & 4 individuals at each qualifier will qualify for the NSEA Eventers Challenge Championship.

EC5) Organisers are asked to ensure that the XC phase includes elements that give a choice about the track and therefore the time taken. Organisers are asked not to display a clock showing the time taken visible to the rider to as the aim is to educate riders to ride by feel.

| Exceeding time limit (2 times the Optimum Time) | Elimination |
