## Classes 1 – 4 NSEA Grass Roots Rules apply

Horse/rider combinations may compete in two consecutive height classes on the same pony 40 & 50 or 50 & 60 or 60 & 70 cm

A GR rider may not jump in 70cm and 40cm or 50cm classes (except h/c)

A rider is not eligible for GR if they are jumping 90cm and may only jump 60 and 70 GR classes if they have completed 5 x 80cm classes.

Class 1 40cm Team & Individual Grass Roots Qualifier (may be led/assisted) Judged on jumping penalties, placings separated on style marks. Not timed

- a) led, unled and running in close proximity with the pony.
- b) assisted- in the ring but does instructor not move with the pony

Top 6 individuals in each section to qualify. Top 6 teams to qualify, which can be made up of riders in either section

Class 2 50cm Team & Individual Grass Roots Qualifier (may be assisted) Optimum time

Class 3 60cm Team & Individual Grass Roots Qualifier (may not be assisted) Single phase

Class 4 70cm Team & Individual Grass Roots Qualifier (may not be assisted) Single phase

- \*\* Restricted riders can only have competed in 60 & 70cm classes, no national championships qualifiers and a maximum of 5 x 80cm class
- \*\*Open riders may have competed in national 70 & 80cm qualifiers, but not 90cm

### Classes 5-7 NSEA 30cm Rule applies

Class 5 70-75 cm RPL Teams & Individuals Open to all Single phase

Class 6 80-85cm RPL Teams & Individuals Single phase

Class 7 90-95cm RPL Teams & Individuals Single phase

NSEA Rules – For the comprehensive Grass Roots Rules go to NSEA General Rules 2023-24 on the NSEA website. See below for eligibility in the height classes:

The purpose of the Grass Roots programme is to provide very novice riders with the opportunity to experience the excitement of competition. The rules are, therefore, kept as flexible as possible but, please embrace the "spirit" of the rules. Please do not use Grass Roots competitions as an easy opportunity to "pot hunt," as it is not in the spirit of the competition. The top 6 teams & individuals at qualifiers will be eligible to compete at any Regional Grass Roots Championships.

Disclaimer... HEALTH. Please do not attend this event if you or any one of your immediate family are experiencing symptoms of covid. Please also do not attend with any horses experiencing any symptoms of respiratory illness and or contagious disease and or is lame or unfit to participate or travel.

This event is open to All. The Organisers for this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. The event is covered by KBIS insurance, HOWEVER all participants must be covered by their own third party insurance, this is a private event and as such not covered by PC insurance.

For clarification, this event will be run under PC SJ Rules 2022, although the Judge's decision is final.

Participants should wear school colours and or individual colours if competing as an individual. HARD HATS must be worn at all times, with chinstrap fastened, when mounted and must conform to PAS015: 2011 with BSI Kitemark, VG1 with BSI Kitemark, Snell E2016 or AS/NZS 3838, 2006 standard.

Hair nets must be worn for any shoulder length or longer hair.All competitors' hats must comply with PC hat rules 2022.

Back protectors are recommended for show jumping.

Anyone assisting (i.e. leading/running alongside a competitor) must wear appropriate clothing and footwear

No jewellery (including earrings) to be worn except for medical jewellery Please take all litter home with you.

Please clear all droppings/hay away from the Unicorn Equestrian Centre, no hay nets outside of trailers and or boxes.

No horse/pony is to compete more than once in any one class without prior agreement with the organiser

All competitors will agree to abide by the rules of the competition.

Entries will close before the closing date if classes are full.

No Dogs on site. All children must be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times. Horses carry risk of unpredictable behaviour and as such any accompanied children may be at risk of harm.

Prize giving will take place at the end of each class.

No entry fees will be refunded for withdrawals after the closing date. All entries are subject to a non-refundable booking fee which will be stated online on a per class basis

#### Your Responsibility

All persons attending the event must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents and must obey instructions given by the Organiser or by officials and stewards on its behalf.

All competitors and those associated with their school are the responsibility of the Team Manager whilst at the competition

All enquiries are to be made by the Team Manager please.

Outside assistance will not be tolerated- and could result in elimination. NSEA affiliated competitors only may warm up & compete horses on the show ground

All competitions, parents and representatives from every school must ensure that they act courteously to stewards and officials at all times. Most of them are volunteers and rudeness is not acceptable.
